Directly we expect about 100 people to attend the event itself with walkers and their supporters/family members as well as staff. The event will be open to the public for anyone to drop in and learn more about our services and programs. In addition, the funds raised will allow us to continue our work creating an indirect benefit to anyone who may require help from Stepping Stones as well as the spinoff benefit to their support systems.

Please describe how the project/event will benefit the community and/or the residents of the Town of Bonnyville:

Stepping Stones has been operating an outreach office in the Town of Bonnyville since 2016 and funds raised from events like Walk A Mile will allow us to continue essential programming that reaches communities within our Lakeland region as Stepping Stones Crisis Society is currently the only sheltering and transitional housing within a 1.5 hour drive radius.

Please specify the amount of funding requested/anticipated from other organizations or government sources:

We are also asking for support for this event from The City of Cold Lake and the MD of Bonnyville in the amount of \$2500 each. We will be reaching out to community and corporate sponsors to assist with the funding for this event.

Please provide any additional information that will assist to support a funding decision: We will be looking to hire local entertainment for this event and use local suppliers in the Lakeland area. This event was an annual event which has been held in both Cold Lake and Bonnyville up until 2020. We stand behind the importance of an event like this in our communities and although this soft launch will take place in Cold Lake for 2024 we do have plans for a larger scale events in 2025.
